

SECOND YEAR

This report provides a summary of PACT activities over our second year, plus an update on our highly ambitious plans for 2023. We feel that accountability and transparency is critical for the sector to move forwards and we expect all PACT students, members & staff to adhere to and champion our high standards and the vision we have for the organisation.

PACT consider the relationships we have with companion animals as partnerships, and take the same approach with individuals, colleagues and organisations that we share the sector with.

Our vision is to revolutionise the companion animal training sector by:

- Teaching, coaching & accrediting Animal Training Instructors using up-to-date, science-led methods
- Promoting the importance of understanding and appreciating canine behaviour, ethology & learning
- Supporting Animal Training Instructors with their emotional, physical & mental wellbeing
- Reducing the environmental impact of living & working with companion animals

This is our forth impact report, which builds upon the mid-year report published in January 2023. We hope that all readers find it as insightful, informative and inspiring as we do producing it..

MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Since May 22 there has been a 52% increase in Full Members of PACT, predominately a mixture of new and previous students passing their assessments. There were also several members transferring from other organisations.

To date 67% of people have passed as Full Members from the old CITC course, with students starting to pass from the January (47%), April (29%) and July (15%) 2022 courses.

PACT is still the second largest ABTC Animal Training Instructor Practitioner Organisation with over 44% of all new ATI registrations over the last 12 months, nearly twice the growth of the next organisation.

STUDENTS

We have supported existing students to complete their courses and attend in-person or conduct remote assessment sessions. 50% of PACT students enrolled on the 'old' course have now successfully met requirements to become full members. Just over 17% of students on the Jan 22 course have passed.

Despite increasing each intake since Jan 23 by 20%, all CTIC have continued to sell out. There are now 63% more PACT students than this time last year..

ADVOCATE MEMBERS

In 2021 we introduced a new membership option, "Associate", following feedback from members we have now updated it "Advocate" we currently have 14 people at this level who we:

- Encourage to participate in further CDP thorough a 25% discounts.
- Require to make a commitment to ethical training methods
- Provide a clear route for those who hold existing ABTC recognised ATI/ABT/CAB qualifications to become Full PACT Members.

ENVIRONMENT


At PACT, our commitments to the environment are overseen by our Director of Sustainability - Jason Light - who is a Chartered Environmentalist. PACT have pledged that we will have a net positive impact on the environment, meaning that we will offset our carbon emissions and any ecological impacts associated with our business activities.

During the second 12 months PACT had a Carbon Footprint (Scopes 1 -3) of 23 tonnes CO2e. The summary chart below illustrates the assessment undertaken by us, including direct emissions (e.g. electricity), transport (which is sometimes unavoidable), purchases and IT Services. Whilst this assessment includes most emissions relating to PACT's activities, we have plans to measure and report on further aspects, such as PACT student and member travel to venues.

Whilst we are looking to further reduce our environmental impacts longer term, we require Carbon Offset schemes to achieve our Net Positive aims. These offset schemes are far from perfect, but we are happy with our choice of The Woodland Trust and have made donations to offset 25 tonnes of carbon (including 2 purchased to cover the October Conference)..

COMPARISON WITH LAST YEAR

The carbon footprint of PACT is much higher in year 2 due to a number of factors. We have a much higher level of paid staff, additional consultants and other costs although some areas such as Air Travel and Uniform spend have reduced.

The footprint of PACT is estimated to be 86kg per member in 22/23, up from 34kg CO2e the previous year.

During the last 12 months PACT's charitable donations, discounts to animal welfare charity staff and scholarships equated to £11,094 this is 25% more than year 1.

We have donated to charities doing fantastic work aligned to PACT's broad societal vision.

The largest area of growth is in Scholarships, with the first two people joining the March 2023 course via the new scholarship programme.





BENEFIT IN KIND

In addition to direct donations to charities, we provide discounts on our courses, webinars and stands at conferences to registered charities in the sector. Over the last 12 months this has included staff from Dog Aid, ABTC, Kids around dogs, Hearing Dogs and Guide Dogs.

OUR FUTURE PLANS


